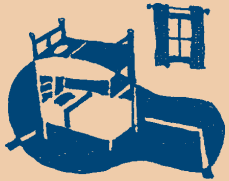

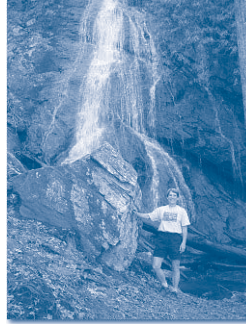


CAMP BROADSTONE

309's Retirement

Farewell to our trusty 309! As far as we know Van 309 has been with Camp Broadstone since the camp was purchased by Appalachian State University. The Dodge Maxi Wagon has put its time in and then some! Throughout the years ole "3 aut 9" has served camp in a number of capacities. With the silvery paint shining in the summer sun, the light blue plaid vinyl too hot to touch, and campers talking loudly (no radio has ever been installed), 309 spent its first summer on the mountain roads of the high country. The original use included safely transporting campers, staff, and camping equipment to the various activities of the summer program. Throughout the years new vans were purchased and 309's primary duties were reassigned to these new safer vehicles. The fate of 309 was uncertain until it was drafted into service again as a working maintenance vehicle. Throughout the years it has served with many different maintenance directors to complete various projects in and around camp. The official



retirement date was December 6, 2004. The odometer reading was 88122. No one is really sure exactly how many miles it really has on it as we are not sure how many times the odometer has rolled over! Even on its last year of service, 309 was known and trusted to drive as far as Hickory, NC. Everett's trusty sidekick has earned its

MALE COUNSELOR IN TRAINING (CIT) CIT must be 16 yrs. old by June 8 OR
MALE JUNIOR CABIN COUNSELOR Junior counselor must be 17 yrs. old by June 8

Responsibilities: Attend June 8-15 staff training, live with and supervise 18 children with two other senior counselors, co-lead a learning group, organize and run evening programs, participate on staff committees, attend all staff meetings. **Qualifications:** At least one summer of camp experience or a related practical experience working with youth, current certification in American Red Cross Standard First Aid and Adult CPR. **Schedule:** General staff training—June 8-15; Camp—June 19-July 29. This person must live in a resident cabin for the entire employment period.



ADVENTURE STAFF—Responsibilities: Attend adventure staff training (May 30-June 3) and June 8-15 general staff training, have the ability to lead or co-lead adventure activities (canoeing, climbing wall, rappelling, high ropes course, Alpine Tower), make ready all equipment and vehicles needed for activities, be willing to participate in the total camp experience when requested and invest your time with individual campers as needed. **Qualifications:** Minimum 19 years old, at least one year of college or equivalent experience, at least one-two seasons or positions leading groups in canoeing, climbing, high ropes course, Alpine Tower, and group problem solving courses, current driver's license with a good driving record and ability to drive 15 passenger vans, current certification in Wilderness First Aid, Adult CPR and Lifeguard Training (or instructor rating in canoeing). **Schedule:** Adventure staff training—May 30-June 3; general staff training—June 8-15; Camp—June 19-July 29.

4 DAY OUT OF CAMP TRIP LEADERS

Responsibilities: 1 of a team of 3 responsible for taking 36 older campers (7th, 8th, 9th graders) and 6 camp counselors on a 4 day off-camp camping venture, assist the assistant director in implementing developed programs of a historical, cultural, and environmental nature, assist in preparation for each trip and the clean up afterwards, attend pre-season staff trainings for the off-camp program as well as the general staff training. **Qualifications:** Minimum 20 years old, at least 2 years of college or equivalent, experience in camping as well as leading outdoor or educational programs, current driver's license with a good driving record and ability to drive 15 passenger vans, current certification in Wilderness First Aid and Adult CPR. **Schedule:** 4 day trip staff training—May 23-28; general staff training—June 8-15; Camp—June 19-July 29.
