

CAMP BROADSTONE BEHAVIOR EXPECTATION AGREEMENT

Camp Broadstone offers a safe and wholesome environment in which campers live, play, and learn as part of a greater community. Camper attitude and behavior are critical to the success of the Broadstone community and each individual makes a difference in the quality of the camp experience.

In order to create a community atmosphere, campers are asked to follow these behavioral guidelines during their camp session. Campers and parents/guardians must read and sign this agreement prior to camp attendance. This form may be submitted along with the camper's health form or at the check-in registration on the opening day of the camper's session.

- I will treat everyone in the camp community with respect at all times, including showing respect for another's personal belongings, privacy, and feelings.
- I understand that harassment based upon race, color, religion, creed, sex, national origin, age, sexual orientation or disability is a form of discrimination in violation of federal and state law and/or Appalachian State University policy, and will not be tolerated.
- I will respect the camp's facilities and equipment and not take or destroy camp property.
- I will not use obscene or foul language or gestures and I will not bring with me music with lyrics which contain obscene or foul language or make reference to violent offensive actions.
- I will not engage in any activity which may put myself, other campers or staff at risk.
- I agree to abide by the rules and regulations of the camp and understand that I am expected to follow directions and guidance provided by the camp staff.
- I agree to abide by the Social Network Policy on page two of this document.

If the camper fails to abide by these behavioral expectations the parent/guardian will be notified by phone and asked to assist in helping their camper make more positive choices. If camper behavior does not improve, the camper will be asked to leave camp. Parents are responsible for their campers travel to and from camp. **Campers asked to leave camp early for behavioral reasons will not receive a refund.**

The following behaviors are considered very serious and will result in immediate expulsion from camp:

1. Possession or use of weapons, illicit, illegal drugs or other controlled substances, tobacco products of any kind and alcoholic beverages.
2. Physical abuse of any kind including hitting, kicking, biting or pushing another camper or staff member.
3. Failure to follow staff instructions thereby resulting in situations that put themselves, other campers, or staff in physical danger.
4. Leaving camp property or assigned program area without the permission of the staff member supervising the area or activity.
5. Verbal abuse of other campers or staff.
6. Behavior that is constantly interfering with the quality of the program other campers are receiving.
7. Campers threatening to harm themselves or other campers.

Camp Broadstone Social Network Policy For Employees, Campers, and Parents

Camp Broadstone offers a safe and wholesome environment in which staff and campers live, play, and learn as part of a community. The proliferation of online social networks (e.g. MySpace and Facebook) has created the potential for inappropriate contact between campers and staff to occur outside of the camp community. We want parents, children, and our staff to be aware of and follow guidelines when they interact online as representatives of Camp Broadstone. Camp Broadstone wants to keep relationships between Staff and Campers professional. We want to teach our Staff how to develop a habit of professionalism for the future. Camp Broadstone is not responsible for actions of individuals on the Internet; however, when staff and campers identify themselves as members of the Broadstone community we feel that we have a right to moderate their online behaviors.

This policy is an extension of Camp Broadstone's Code of Conduct for employees and campers. Online violations of the code of conduct will be treated in the same manner as violations that occur at camp, which includes termination for employees and being sent home for campers. These policies are in place for the protection of campers and the protection of camp staff. Campers and employees should note that for the purposes of this policy, personal internet sites, instant messages, emails, and blogs are also considered to be social networks. Employees of Broadstone understand that all of your online actions reflect to your character, which is reflection to Camp Broadstone. Broadstone staff will monitor online activities of those who identify themselves as members of the Broadstone community online.

- All behaviors that are prohibited under Camp Broadstone's Codes of Conduct are also prohibited in online social networks.
- Staff members are instructed not to give any personal contact information to Campers.
- Staff are not allowed to add campers as friends on social networks*
- Staff who identify themselves as members of the Broadstone community should remove actions and activities from their online profiles that are inappropriate for the camp community.
- Staff are allowed to keep pictures of campers; however, they are not allowed to distribute them via email or post them online.
- Staff are not allowed to post or comment on pictures of campers.
- Staff will not post pictures of themselves using or alcohol, tobacco, or other drugs.
- Staff will not have direct or indirect references to alcohol, tobacco, or other drugs anywhere on their profile.
- Staff and campers will follow the policies of the social network sites to which they belong.
- Staff and campers will review messages received from visitors to their profile and remove messages that reflect negatively on you and/or Broadstone.
- Staff are instructed not to initiate or continue direct contact from campers.
- Staff and campers will report violations to this policy to year-round staff at Camp Broadstone.

Parents' responsibility:

Camp Broadstone encourages parents to monitor their child's/children's online activities. Please contact Camp Broadstone immediately if you find violations to this policy have occurred.

* Realizing the importance of building positive relationships at Camp Broadstone, we make exceptions for preexisting friendships developed when staff members were campers.
